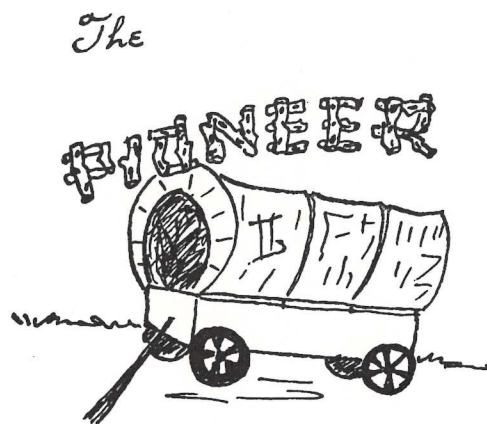

Board of Directors



At the close of this, the eighth year of Lakewood Park Bible School, we are happy to present our seventh annual year book. As we look back over the eight years we think of many mountain peaks of blessing both financially and spiritually. Our school is dedicated to the task of instructing our youth in the knowledge of the Word of God. To date one hundred fifteen students have been ministered to for one semester or more within our class rooms. Of these a goodly number have found their places in active service either as pastors or helpers in the work of the local churches.

It is essential that the student have a solid foundation in sound theology. We teach that the Bible is the final source of authority on matters religious. The doctrines of salvation, of God, of Christ, and of the Holy Spirit are clearly presented. Bible Prophecy, Ages and Dispensations, Divine Healing, Pastoral Theology and Typology have their place in the curriculum.

In addition to the above subjects which are more strictly theological we cover the contents of the entire Bible under such headings as Pentateuch, Bible History and Geography, Wisdom Literature, Old Testament Prophets, Gospels, Acts, Life of Paul, Epistles of Paul, Hebrews, General Epistles, Epistles of John and Pastoral Epistles. We find out how we get our Bible in a course called Bible Introduction and how to use our Bible in a course called Personal Evangelism.

Courses classified as Christian Education include Child Study, two courses on the Sunday

to be "thoroughly furnished unto every good
work". These are included under such titles as
Homiletics, Church History, Missions, Hermen-
eutics, Polemics, English, Church Discipline,
Prayer, Parliamentary Law, and Music.

A thorough knowledge of all the foregoing
subjects is only of real value as we use it in
practical service. Therefore we, as a school,
arrange as many outlets for service as possible.
These include institutional work in hospitals,
jails, and old folks homes as well as out-station
work in new fields or in assisting near-by pas-
tors. There are weekly student services which
give students an opportunity to get experience
in various aspects of a gospel service. Bible
clubs are also conducted which give valuable
experience in children's work.

A Bible teacher of sainted memory called

ground." We can assure you that we find great
delight as we gather with our students within
our hallowed class rooms to consider the pre-
cious truths of God's Holy Word. We extend a
warm welcome to all Christian young people
to join us as we pursue our search in the

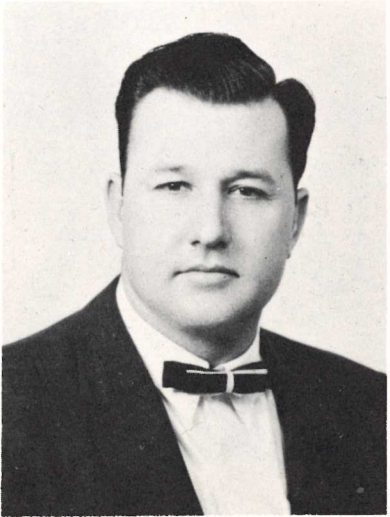

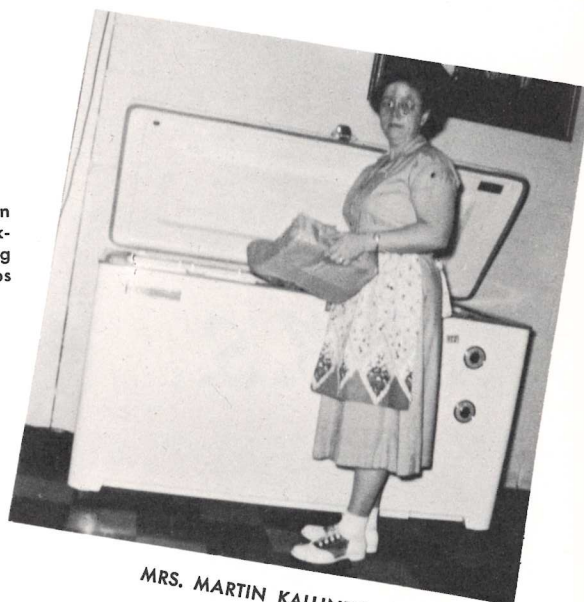




REV. E. A. MILLER

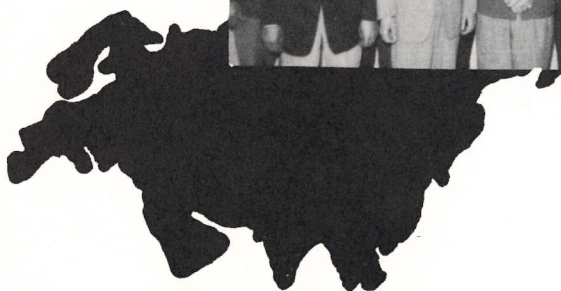
