
Carl Klein




Rev. Roy H. Wead






President's Award

"A Bright New Day for TBI"

A new day began to dawn for Trinity Bible Institute as the sun was setting on the life of a state institution of higher learning Friday, January 9, 1970. On that date, Carnegie Hall and the Home Economics building of the University of North Dakota Branch located in Ellendale, North Dakota, were destroyed by fire. The loss was estimated at \$512,000.00, but still standing was a \$4 - million campus comprised of 23 buildings and 40 acres.

The motto placed upon the rubble by members of the student body read - "THINK BUILD." The Word of God states so plainly, "Unless the Lord build the house, they that build it labor in vain . . ." The front page of the February 4, 1973 "Fargo Forum" summed up the plight of the UND - Ellendale Branch in these words: "Declining student enrollments, increasing student costs, and then the coup de grace, a disastrous fire January 9, 1970, combined to finish off UND-EB as a public institution of higher education after 71 years." This historic happening consummated July 1, 1971.

By September of 1972, Trinity had been selected from 122 prospects to occupy the \$4 - million campus at a cost to her of \$1.

What happened? The old adage, "Prayer Changes Things" ever rings true. The administration, faculty, students, and friends of TBI prayed. Then God moved onto the scene, prevailed upon legislative groups in the State of North Dakota and community action groups in Ellendale, North Dakota; and a bright new day dawned for TBI, whose record enrollment prior to September 1972 had been 248 students. 1972, Trinity's first year on the new miracle campus, proved to be another record-breaking year with 333 students; and 1974, yet another record-breaking year with 420 students in attendance.

The news of the TBI miracle has spread like a prairie fire across the nation, and the Spirit of God is moving upon the hearts of young people everywhere to turn to the study of His Word. Trinity's president, Roy H. Wead, believes that the miracle of the Ellendale campus and the school's phenominal growth is directly attributable to the motto which TBI claims - - "We aim to saturate our youth with God's truth."

TRINITY - - May she ever hold to the principles upon which she was founded. May God's radiance ever penetrate her walls, and may the Truth spring up within the bosom of all who attend her halls of learning until the whole world knows that "JESUS SAVES."







Through all the hustle and bustle of moving in, saying hello to some and good-bye to others - students find a new home and new friends.























Seniors


















Prayer Corps Members hear a report of answered prayer - one of many placed on the VICTORY BOARD.

The Prayer Gap for men is located in the basement of the men's dorm and fondly referred to as the "Prophet's Chamber."


These 24 hour per day around the clock prayer chains have a profound effect upon the campus atmosphere and weekend ministry and tour travel.

The results of missionaries on the field is determined by people at home who interceed on their behalf.


























Nationwide Telecast






Radio and Communications




Kampus Kouples Thirty-eight married couples live in housing



The leading scorer for the team was 6'1" Scott Carlin who averaged 18.3 points per game and also led the team in assists with 116. Doug Proctor, 6'5" freshman brought down 209 rebounds for the season.


Trinity shot an average of 101 points per game and gave up 72 points per outing. With an average height of 6'1" per man the 8 returning lettermen and nine newcomers blended together to give Trinity its strongest hardwood squad in the history of the college.

The squad chose 3 captains honoring Steve Wagler, Galen Workcuff and Craig Seibold. All have played important roles in Trinity's basketball program for the past two years. Workcuff has maintained a 20 point average throughout his three years on the team.
