Trinity encourages a Bible-centered life of service following Biblical principles. The knowledge, skills and attitudes of a student should include:


- 1. A working knowledge of the Bible and Christian doctrine.

- 6. A sensitivity to human needs at home and abroad.

The academic program is designed so that students may enroll in the B.A. degree program, the A.A. degree program, or the diploma or certificate of accomplishment program.






Dedication

Trinity Bible Institute received endorsement at the Collegiate Level from the Assemblies of God Board of Education during the Board's annual meeting in November.

Trinity Bible Institute was started in 1948 on the North Dakota District campgrounds. It was first known as Lakewood Park Bible School.

In 1960 the school moved to Aberdeen, S. Dak., and became known as Hub City Bible School. While there it used the facilities of the Assembly of God Tabernacle.

In 1967, the former Trinity Hospital building in Jamestown, N. Dak., was purchased. When the school was moved to Jamestown it took the name of the former hospital and became Trinity Bible Institute.

When the University of North Dakota, Ellendale Branch, was closed, TBI was able to acquire its excellent facilities. The move to Ellendale was made in 1972.

TBI is owned and operated by the North and South Dakota District Councils of the Assemblies of God. The school offers a 3-year program leading to an associate of arts degree in the following fields: Bible Ministerial, Bible General, Bible Christian Education, Bible Missions, Bible Music, and Bible Business. A 4-year program is also offered leading to bachelor of arts degree in Bible Ministerial or Bible General, according to President Wead. Lest we forget the pioneers of the past who at great sacrifice followed the leading of the Holy Spirit in the birth of our school, we pay tribute to a lovely lady who was part of that beginning.

Miss Mildred Duncklee joined the staff at Lakewood Park Bible Institute in Devil's Lake, North Dakota in 1948. She remained with the school for 10 years. When asked what she taught, she smiled and said, "A little of everything."

Her love for Christ and her dedication to instill the Word of God in the hearts of His followers led her to a teaching ministry on the mission field in Africa. She is now engaged in Bible School ministry in Liberia.

Several former students of TBI have served as secretary and traveling companion to Miss Duncklee, both here and in Africa.

To those who worked, gave and prayed we say, ''Thank you.''

MEMORIAL

Funeral services for Peter Walker, age 69, were held Friday, April 7 in the Walter and Hattie Block Memorial Chapel on TBI campus in Ellendale, ND. Family, friends and the entire Trinity family attended the funeral services conducted by President Roy H. Wead, Rev. James Hessler, Spokane, Washington, Rev. John Arnold, Secretary-Treasurer of the Ohio District and Rev. Marcus Bakke, Assistant District Superintendent of North Dakota.

Rev. Walker went to be with our Lord, April 3, following an 8-day illness. He was active in ministry until his death at the Assembly of God church in Salem, Ohio where he taught adult Bible classes and was on the faculty of the Bible school sponsored by the church. Rev. Walker was a member of the TBI faculty for 10 years, prior to his retirement in 1976.

The spirit of the Lord was very present as the life of our beloved brother was eulogized. A fitting climax to the time of remembrance for this man who was noted for his love for the ministry of the Holy Spirit was a message in tongues and interpretation to lift the hearts of those who so keenly felt the loss of their relative, teacher and friend.

A mini operatic was presented during the spring semester. The Gospel message of "A Man in the Dark" made a lasting impact upon the Trinity Family.








Troubadours Director, Kaye Garrison





House of Music

Talents develop as students participate in piano and voice classes at the House of Music studios. Applied lessons in voice, piano, and organ advance them into solo status for ministry of music in churches, chapel, or ministerial outreach and evangelism. Once a week a Repertoire Workshop offers an opportunity to sing or play before friends to gain confidence and technique for solo excellence.

An electronic piano lab with earphones is welcomed by beginners in keyboard. Regular pianos and practice rooms with accompanists serve the voice students who need help in learning solos. A new Allen digital computer organ is available for practice to organ students. The large tudio room is versatile for classes, recitals, or ensembles. It is encouraging for beginners to hear others in the next stages of development and gives them a concept of their own possibilities as well as a wide exposure to the repertoire heritage we have from all periods, cultures, composers, and denonimations.



All in all, the 78-79 season was very rewarding for the Crusaders, spiritually as well as competitively.



TRINTIY BIBLE INSTITUTE GRANTED ENDORSEMENT

Trinity Bible Institute, Ellendale, North Dakota, was recently granted endorsement at the collegiate level by the Assemblies of God Board of Education. The endorsement of TBI brings to 10 the number of colleges endoresed by the Board.

As a specialized college, Trinity Bible Institute offers only **one major** — Bible and theology, with supporting courses in practices, missions, and Christian education, and a general education core of over 40 credits.

These requirements apply whether the student is enrolled in the four-year B.A. degree program, or in the three-year program leading to the A.A. degree. The difference is in the amount of supportive studies included in the program.

The major (Bible) and three concentrations are offered in the Department of Bible Studies; MINISTERIAL, GENERAL BIBLE, MISSIONS. Students enrolled in the ministerial or general Bible concentration take 50 semester credits in the Bible supporting areas; students enrolled in the missions concentration take 45; and all other students take a minimum of 40 as recommended by the American Association of Bible Colleges. The above concentrations enroll 75% of the student body.

Five additional concentrations are offered: CHRISTIAN EDUCATION, SOCIAL SCIENCE, COMMUNICATIONS, MUSIC, and BUSINESS. A concentration require 30 semester credits in that area or in related subjects.

Individualized Programs: Instead of concentration, interdisciplinary combinations may be arranged consisting of two or three minors. An example would be a 40 credit Major in Bible/theology, with two minors from Christian Education, Social Science, Communications, Music or Business.

MINORS: Minors are offered in the same areas (except Bible/theology) and require 18 to 20 semester credits.

The fall 1978 enrollment at TBI was 411. The school holds candidacy status with the American Association of Bible Colleges, the accrediting association for Bible colleges.

The 1978-1979 officers at TBI have been long connected with A/G education. President Roy H. Wead has now served for ten years, and as a Non-resident Executive Presbyter has served on the Board of Directors of Central Bible College, and is currently on the Board of Directors of the Assemlies of God Graduate School. Dr. A. Edward Strang taught at Southeastern CAG for eight years, and at Bethany BC for seven years, and is now Dean of Students at TBI. Dr. Ward R. Williams was at SCC eight years, SCAG in Lakeland for five years, and at EC fourteen years; he is now Academic Dean at TBI. Vice President George Holmes taught Homiletics in the A /G Bible School in London. Registrar David Zink was Director of the SCAG Extension Branch in Jacksonville.
