



The TBI family is made up of single and married students, their wives and children, and the faculty and staff who live, work and worship together in Christian community and love.





# IDEALS to sow TEACHERS to show

The textbook at Trinity is the Bible — taught by spirit-filled instructors in accordance with the highest academic standards. Fifty hours in classroom instruction in Bible and seventy-eight hours in related subjects are required to receive a B.A. in Ministerial Program. Areas of study include Communications, Social Science, Music, Business, Christian Education, Missions and Ministerial and Bible General.

The teachers at Trinity take a personal interest in the students and are willing to share their ideas and ideals. Faculty members work hard to make every subject relevant to pastoral and on-field situations gleaned from their own practical experiences. They are dedicated and industrious — each one with a unique story which tells of the divine leading of God which resulted in their being at Trinity. Their openness and honesty as they closely associate with the student body in academic and social living is a valuable source of learning experience for the perceptive scholar.

In addition to the high academic training offered at TBI, every effort is made to provide opportunity for the student to demonstrate their skills in ministry on and off-campus. The campus churches for married and single students are an outlet for Ministerial and Christian education ministry. The student work program encourages the use of skills required in office procedure, maintenance duties and various jobs. Music students are urged to participate in community and campus events. The communication outlet includes serving as disc jockey on the campus radio station, publishing a student newspaper, and working with photography and printing.

#### THE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

to

#### Trinity Bible Institute Board of Directors

**November 5, 1980** 

Topping the news around Trinity Bible Institute this month is the fact that full accreditation has been granted to TBI. Tuesday, October 21, President Wead accompanied by Dr. A.E. Strang, met with the AABC Accrediting Commission in Chicago. Thursday morning they were notified privately that TBI had been approved and granted full accreditation. The announcement was made public that same evening in the AABC convention.

Accreditation means various things to different people. Scores of telegrams and phone calls have been received from across the nation like the one from General Superintendent T.F. Zimmerman.

"On behalf of the General Council of the Assemblies of God, we send heartiest congratulations on Trinity's accreditation. We pray God's continued rich blessing upon the school."

Ellendale's local newspaper featured a front page headline **AABC Accredits Trinity** and began the article with "Ellendale is again the home of an accredited college." The article goes on to state:

"At its annual convention in Chicago last week, the American Association of Bible Colleges (AABC) awarded Trinity Bible Institute (TBI) full accreditation.

Trinity President Roy H. Wead and Dr. Edward Strang, academic dean, were in Chicago to personally hear the Association announce its decision privately on Thursday morning and again to the convention that evening.

'I felt greatly relieved,' Wead told the Leader on Tuesday morning. 'I had tried to psyche myself up so that no matter what happened we were going to continue and do the job.'

Wead and Strang met with AABC's accrediting commission for about an hour on Tuesday to respond to questions concerning an evaluation Trinity underwent in April and to explain the steps the Bible college was taking to meet the Association's recommendations for accreditation.

TBI was one of three institutions to receive accreditation. Of the others, one is located in Los Angeles and the other in western Canada. A total of ten schools were being considered for accreditation.

With the accreditation, Trinity's president expects the size of the college's student body to increase.

He thinks that while Trinity's candidacy status with AABC allowed the college to operate with the same privileges as an accreditated institution, some students misinterpreted the term and went to school elsewhere. To such students, candidacy was synonymous with being a candidate for elective office. Unlike the candidate that first has to win to take up office, being named a candidate by AABC was a form of winning in itself. From that point on students were eligible to receive government programs as well as have their credits transferred.

But being accredited clears any chance of misunderstanding. With AABC's accreditation, Trinity falls under the umbrella of the Council on Postsecondary Accreditation (COPA). This means that Trinity should be regarded as being fully accredited in the same way that a general purpose or liberal arts college is accredited because the bylaws of COPA supports mutual recognition among its members.

Trinity began seeking accreditation five years ago. For two years the college held applicant status with AABC and candidacy status the last three years. During this period the college was evaluated. Along with pointing out the institution's strengths and shortcomings, AABC helped direct the college to a course of action that would bring full accreditation if standards were met."

Other pertinent information that may be of interest to you:

There are now 77 accredited schools in AABC: approximately 12 candidate; and 45 applicant schools with another 30 or more schools represented at the annual convention. Of the 77 accredited, TBI ranks 33rd in enrollment. TBI's library ranks 7th in size.

Accreditation is granted for a ten-year period with periodic consultive visits during that time. At the conclusion of each ten-year period a school is expected to go through a full self study and evaluation program similar to that required for accreditation in the beginning.

Enrollment this fall is 363, up exactly 30 from last year. With the confusion about accreditation removed, we should expect a stable enrollment the next couple years and then a solid growth pattern.




#### Leroy Kirschenmann







#### **APPRECIATION**

The Alumnus of the Year Nominations are made by the Alumni and the executive committee then chooses 5-8 individuals from that list. A roll call sheet is sent out and members cast their ballot by mail. The honoree must be active in the ministry, as a lay person, pastor, evangelist or an administrator; must have been graduated (not just attended) for at least 5 years and must support TBI faithfully by way of finances, and/or students.

While at Trinity, Bob was active in the Troubadour ministry. During his senior year he was in charge of a street ministry group that ministered in the inner-city of Chicago. After graduation he returned to Chicago and established an inner-city church. His great love and compassion for people coupled with his dedication and zeal touched the lives of many needy people.

Bob and Sherry and their two children are presently itinerating in preparation for missionary service in Eurasia.

#### Robert McCown

Family members and friends gathered together, Thursday, November 20 in the Trinity Bible Institute Chapel to express their love for Bob McCown, a man who was an example of the believer in word, in conversation, in love, spirit, faith and purity. Rev. McCown, age 39, died of cancer, Sunday, November 16, at Memorial Hospital in Ellendale.

The McCown family came to Ellendale in 1973 where he was an instructor at TBI and later became Pastor of the First Baptist Church in addition to his teaching. Survivors include his widow, Beth; two sons, Bruce and Brent; and two daughters, Brenda and Belinda.

Rev. McCown was the kind of man who is not easily replaced. His primary ministry was to people and the love that he shared changed lives. The students who were in his Homiletics, Speech, Composition and Graphic classes were tender products of his unselfish love. He gave of himself, humbly and patiently, as he drew from them their best academic ability. He never spoke a harsh word: his soft-spoken mannerisms always brought out the best in each person. When discipline was necessary, it was done tenderly and with every consideration to be a building block in the life of the student.

To this man we owe a debt. Those who benefited from his academic expertise can continue to sow their skills and teach others as he taught them. His life was short, but complete. He accomplished more in his brief life than others do in twice the time. His industry and energy seemed to be endless.

In loving memory of this man of God who walked among us, we dedicate this yearbook. Many of the skills he taught us in photography and printing are contained in it. Our prayer, as his would have been, is that it will bring Glory to our God.






### HOUSE OF MUSIC

### The Fred J. Graham Library

The 56,000 volume library is housed in a brick building with fire-resistant stack room, and was built in 1930.

The library, as a member of the North Dakota Network for Knowledge and of the MINITEX systems, provides access to a midwest consortium of libraries.

The library provides listening stations, viewing facilities, photocopy service, typing facilities, tape duplication, as well as traditional study and research facilities.

### OCLC in operation

The Fred J. Graham Library made one giant step forward as the long anticipated installation of the OCLC computer system was realized in October. This highly technological service department links all the individual library systems to one large center in Columbus, Ohio. This center has a computer complex which presently has summaries on over five million books and similar materials. The computer relays this information to the member libraries through telephone lines. The Trinity library, the 7th largest library of the 77 accredited by the AABC, is one of almost 2300 libraries to have the OCLC computer system. This service will accelerate cataloging, and make inter-library loan material available to the student body. 

#### Roy H. Wead, President

In September of 1968, Roy H. Wead became the first President of Trinity Bible Institute. Pres. Wead has served on many college boards and was not a stranger to education. He served on the Board of Directors for eighteen years at Central Bible College in Springfield, Missouri. He was one of the founding directors and currently serves on the board of the Assemblies of God Graduate School, Springfield, Missouri.

The Rev. Wead began his ministry in Ohio and ministered as evangelist, pastor and youth director. He later became the first District Superintendent of the Indiana District Council of the Assemblies of God. The Indiana District led the nation as the fastest growing District within the most rapidly growing church movement in the United States under his leadership. After fourteen years of serving as District Superintendent of Indiana, he accepted the pastorate of Calvary Temple in South Bend, Indiana. During his ministry at South Bend, he produced a daily television program which appeared regularly for seven years. A new church was built under his leadership and was valued at over the one and one-half million dollars. He continued in this pastorate in South Bend until he accepted the presidency of Trinity Bible Institute.

Rev. Wead has been a General Presbyter of the Assemblies of God for 33 years and served on the national Executive Board for the last 21 years, a position he continues to hold.

Rev. Wead has traveled extensively having made a number of trips, literally, around the world and visits to South America for special ministry seven different years.

The Rev. Wead married Rosa Mae Short of Oklahoma City on January 4, 1940. They have four sons, James, Bill, Doug, and Tim. Both the Rev. and Mrs. Wead are ordained ministers of the Assemblies of God and have very active schedules. Several of their immediate family are also active in full-time Christian ministry.


