





MEMORIAL

One evening in September a faculty member received a phone call from California. Darrell Walker had died in a car accident. Everybody who knew Darrell was struck with awe as the word spread. The news was starkly final.

After graduating in 1978, Darrell and Donna Walker moved to San Francisco to carry out the call that God had placed on their hearts. They started Agape Incorporated, an outreach ministry to the Tenderloin area. Their desire was to see God's Spirit flow in the streets of San Francisco. Along with several other alumnus from Trinity, they worked for several years to establish a church known as The Candle.

In a letter from Donna following the funeral, she expressed all of our sentiments ably: "I felt great sorrow at first, but the Lord revealed to me that through worship and praise I am with Him; the Prince of Peace . . . It's as though we are together praising God!"

We will miss Darrell and our prayers are continually with Donna and their three children as they carry on the work. THE CANDLE they lit will continue to glow for Jesus until He returns.

MEMORIAL 1905-1981

Rev. B.C. Heinze passed away on Tuesday, December 22, 1981 following an extended illness. He was 76. Rev. Heinze, a pioneer pastor for 50 years, began as a teenager. He was ordained into the ministry on October 29, 1926 at Vermillion, South Dakota. He and his wife pastored in Wisconsin, Minnesota, Nebraska, North and South Dakota. Rev. Heinze was an assistant superintendent of the State of South Dakota and a General Presbyter of the General Council, and was on the board of directors of North Central Bible College in Minneapolis.

Brother Heinze had twenty years of experience in radio ministry. He was also on the staff of what is now Trinity Bible Institute and taught for ten years, full and part time while pastoring nearby. He established the Indian Gospel Mission in Sisseton.

We extend our sympathy to Sister Heinze and family.

ROY H. WEAD, president of Trinity Bible Institute since 1968, has announced his resignation effective June 30, 1982.

Under Wead's capable leadership, TBI has developed from a three-year program located in Jamestown, ND to a fully accredited four-year Bible college on a 40-acre campus in Ellendale. During the 14 years of his leadership, Trinity received accreditation from the American Association of Bible Colleges (AABC) as well as endorsement from the Assemblies of God. This spring, the class of 1982 will graduate students that will be qualified for state certification as public school teachers in North Dakota, another milestone for TBI.

Roy H. Wead is an executive presbyter of the General Council of the Assemblies of God with over 15,000 ministers and 10,000 churches. He came to TBI from a nine-year pastorate of Calvary Temple in South Bend, Indiana, one of the largest churches in the Assemblies of God. Prior to that, he served as District Superintendent of the Indiana Assemblies of God where he saw over 120 new churches open and develop.


Wead, a native of North Dakota, graduated from Central Bible College in Springfield, Missouri and held a variety of pastorates since being ordained in 1940.

President and Mrs Wead will make their home in Springfield, MO, where he will be associated with his son, Doug, an evangelist and author who is gaining prominence as a motivational speaker.

Trinity's President said, "I'm always excited about doing a new thing, but I'm not going to forget Trinity." During his years as president, TBI was financially able to operate in the "black" and Wead said, "I will continue to work with the school and am now working on some financial programs that hopefully will help."

















BIG/LITTLE SISTERS
