


WATER BAPTISM

Their tours and week-end ministries include North and South Dakota, Wyoming, and Montana.







They were privileged to minister in three black churches in the Chicago area. They were also privileged to minister in many churches pastored by TBC alumni.



The "Lifesavers", a TBC MAPS team, spent two months during the summer of 1983 ministering in the South Pacific island nations of Fiji, Tonga and Vanuatu. The group, lead by Lavonne Larson, consisted of Joy Zimmerman, Jill Zimmerman, Renee Jost and Candy Braunberger. While in Tonga the Lifesavers ministered in the new Tonga Bible Institute as well as in village Children's Bible Clubs and churches. A highlight of the Tongan stay was a feast prepared in their honor complete with octopus and root vegetables prepared in an earth oven.

Speaking in schools, to women's groups, youth groups, to S.S. teachers, and conducting evangelistic services kept the group's schedule full and exciting. Puppet stories, special music and short drama presentations attracted children and adults. The thrill of seeing lives changed and touched surpassed

inconveniences or fatique, as when Anna, a hotel receptionist, found Christ.

In spite of cultural differences and speaking with an interpreter, there was an awareness that the Holy Spirit was at work. The Lifesavers returned, after 58 days and a total of 87 services, feeling enriched by many memories of committed missionaries and national workers, of exotic tropical scenery and strange cuisine, and of loving people, hungry for spiritual food. But most of all, they had deeper conviction that God will use whoever and whatever is dedicated to Him.

The "Spokesmen for Christ" completed their 2,500 mile biking tour last summer in 41 days. Troy Evans, Jeff Nelson, Andy Sands, Brad Purfeerst and Loren Sandoz left Ellendale on April 10 and arrived in Miami on June 10. They ministered in 30 churches along the way, using drama and sign language to present messages about salvation, the Holy Spirit, or parables like "The Good Samaritan".

The team had many wonderful experiences, made many friends, and considered their "Gospel Trek" a complete success.


The cross-country team showed great improvement this year, competing in one conference meet two dual meets, and three invitational meets. They took second place in the conference meet.

Karla Knutson won the women's division at the St. Paul meet, but because she felt the greatest all-around improvement had been made by Tammy Collins, presented her with the medal.


