


We are foreigners who don't belong.



The controversy goes on with many Americans still attempting to ban God from public schools.






#### PRESIDENT LUNDSTROM

- In 1976 he was listed as one of the outstanding young men in America.








## '84 GRADUATION







As Brother Malz challenged the student body concerning giving to TBC missionary commitments, over \$3000 was pledged in monthly support.






### MISSIONS CONVENTION


## MAPS PRESENTATION



expression of praise that came from the over 180 people in the Fieldhouse.



Ten students received credit this year for "on the job" training while they worked with a missionary-pastor in Bountiful, Utah, to help establish a new work.


Located in Mormon country, the students lived and worked in the community and witnessed one-to-one in order to be accepted. This church is now averaging 90 in attendance!















## CRUSADERS CROSS COUNTRY







TBC and North Central had met three times during the season and each time North Central had won—twice in league play and again in the semi-finals of the NICC league tournament held in Ellendale, February 28 through March 2.

According to TBC head coach, Bob Tatum, "The team played excellent defense and maintained patient offensive play to go ahead late in the second half after trailing for most of the game."

The Crusaders played well in the championship game against North-west Christian College, but just did not have the man power to stay with the talented, smooth and extremely quick team from Eugene, OR.

The Oregon team won their third National Bible College Championship in a row by defeating Trinity 87 to 59.

Jeff Kenney, from Fargo, was named to the All-American Bible College team as well as being selected to the all-tournament team. Also, Coach Bob Tatum was selected by his peer coaches to be named the "Tournament coach of the year" for the NBCAA in 1985.

The Crusader team returned to Ellendale Sunday afternoon at 3:00 p.m. to find a group of enthusiastic fans to welcome them back.

LeAnn Holt was also awarded All-American status.





Only full-time students are eligible. To be considered full-time, a student must have accumulated 50+ percent of his total TBC credits on a full-time (12+ SH) basis. Also, students must be in full-time attendance during the semester the scholarship is awarded to be eligible.
