








PAUL DAVIDSON



The following are portions from the text of Rev. Paul Davidson's message on The Cross given on October 7, 1988 in the Friday morning chapel service during Homecoming.

I Corinthians 11:17-34 deals with the Lord's Supper. I want to focus on one verse-"tarry one for another."

A strong church was built in Corinth in the two to three years that Paul was there. He leaves to begin a ministry in Ephesus. Back in Corinth problems began to spring up. One can only wonder how a church that had such a marvelous beginning could have so many problems in their midst.

They had all received the message of the cross; Christ had died for their sins. They had received the message of the cross; they that are Christ's have crucified Body as each were filled with the Holy Spirit. What went wrong?

As they moved away from the cross, pride and materialism began to fill their hearts. When they moved away from the cross, they lost a sense of the sinfulness of sin. When they moved away from the cross, their hearts became hard and calloused toward their brethren. When they moved away from the cross, fleshly lust once again became the controlling passion. When they forgot the message of the cross, forgot to take it up daily, they become carnal and walk as men. Their viewpoint becomes that of the flesh and strife and division results.

Confusion marked their day: confusion marks ours today. Why? Is it because we have also moved away from the message of the cross and become carnal like the Corinthian church?

What was Paul's hope of estabthe flesh with the affections and lishing a church in that sinful city of lusts thereof. They had all been Corinth? One message, the mesbaptized by one Spirit into one sage of the cross. That was the only message that could save them. He knew it was the only I Cor. 3:3, "You are yet carnal." message that could restore them

and bring them back from their sins.

There is no other answer. Because of the cross, there is no condemnation. Because of the cross, I am free from sin. Because of the cross, the world no longer has a pull in my life. We need to return to its message.

The cross must be taken up daily. There isn't a shred of hope you will ever make heaven if you

don't take it up daily. There is no hope you will break from lust or evil sexual desire. The cross, it alone has the power to free you

from it all.

Philippians 2:1-5 reads: If therefore there is any encouragement in Christ, if there is any consolation of love, if there is any fellowship of the Spirit, if any affection and compassion make my joy complete being of the same mind, maintaining the same love, united in spirit intent on one purpose. Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind let each of you regard one another as more important than himself; do not merely look out for your own interests, but also for the interests of others. Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus.

What is lust, but the sacrifice of others for self. What is Christ's view, but the cross and sacrifice of self for others.

Paul Davidson was a Bible Instructor at Trinity from 1969 until 1984.



BIBLICAL STUDIES

Trinity is committed to prepare Christian workers for various areas of ministry and Christian service. As a result, Biblical Studies is the core around which all programs center at Trinity. Biblical Studies becomes the basis of the Christian experience and knowledge with which to interpret all other disciplines. Studies include classes in the Old Testament and New Testament, general Bible, and theology. Classes include studies in doctrine and theology, research and study tools for study of the Bible, as well as surveys and individual studies of books of the Bible.

MINISTERIAL STUDIES

Ministerial Studies involves a double major in combination with the Biblical Studies major. It is for those students who wish to pursue a full-time pastoral or evangelistic ministry or plan further studies at the seminary level. Classes include Principles of Preaching, Ministerial Relations, Church Administration, and Personal Evangelism. The program also includes ministry internship where students have the opportunity to minister in a practical setting under the supervision of an experienced pastor.

ELEMENTARY EDUCATION




CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

The Christian Education minor is a program designed for students wishing to pursue full-time ministry in Christian Education, to prepare for graduate level work in Christian Education, or to serve the Lord in the Christian Education program of the local church. Courses include foundations in Christian Education, Ministry to Children, Ministry to Youth, and Ministry to Adults.



BUSINESS

Two minors are offered in the business area. The minor in Office Administration is designed to acquaint the student with basic clerical skills and knowledge necessary to obtain employment in a para-church organization. The minor in Business Management is designed to acquaint the student with basic managerial skills to assist a church in handling its business affairs. Instructors include (r) Leroy Kirschenmann, Ermalene Bentz, and Robert Hessling.



HUMAN RELATIONS



The Human Relations minor is a logical combination with the Biblical Studies major for those students wishing to pursue a ministry which requires extra "people skills" training. It is an excellent choice for those interested in non-pastoral para-church ministries. Instructors include (r) Judy Cochran.

MUSIC

The Music Minor combined with the Biblical Studies major prepares students wishing to pursue a music ministry or who desire to complete a music majors in another college. Dr. Sharon Carbaugh (r & Lower r) is an instructor and Chairperson of the department. Charlotte Hvistendahl (lower I) also teaches.








GENERAL EDUCATION

The general education courses are the academic base upon which the programs of the college are built. 


















GUEST CHAPEL SPEAKERS
