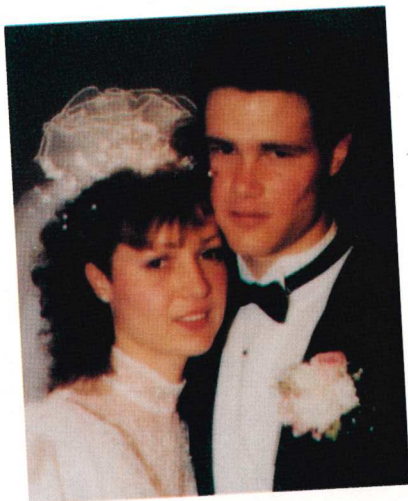
DOUG WHITLOCK

A monolith on the state line marks the division between North and South Dakota.



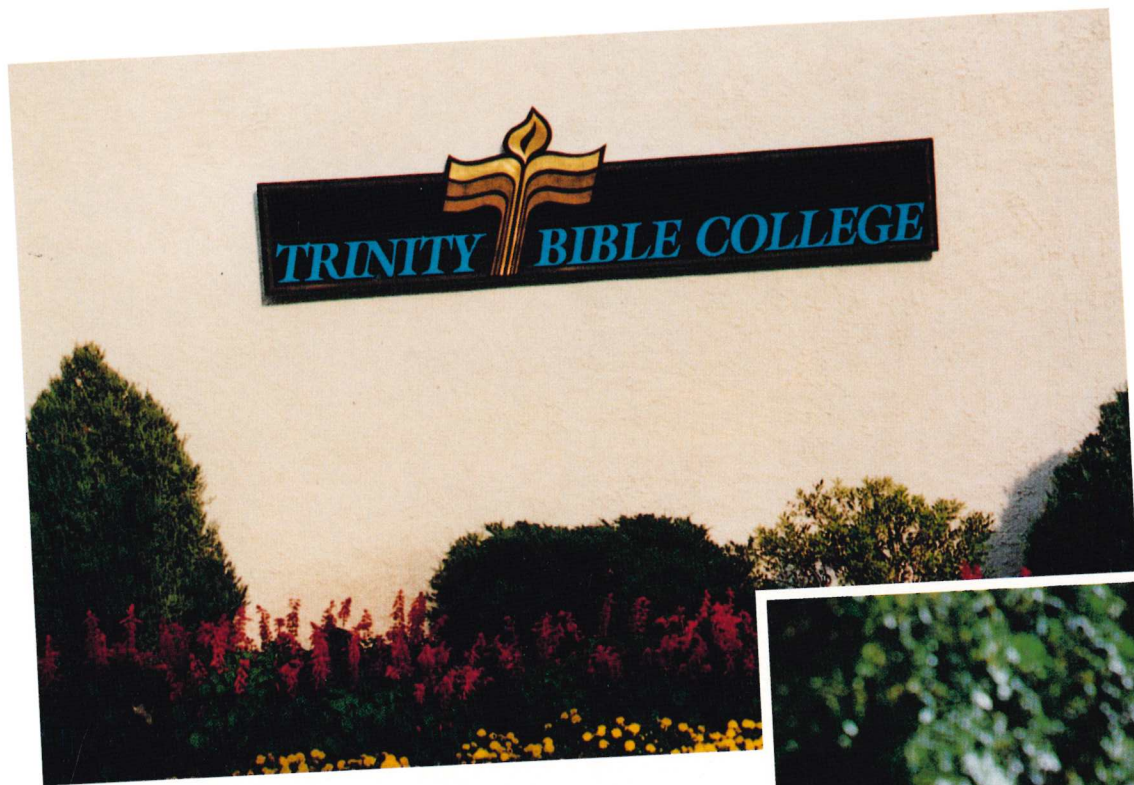

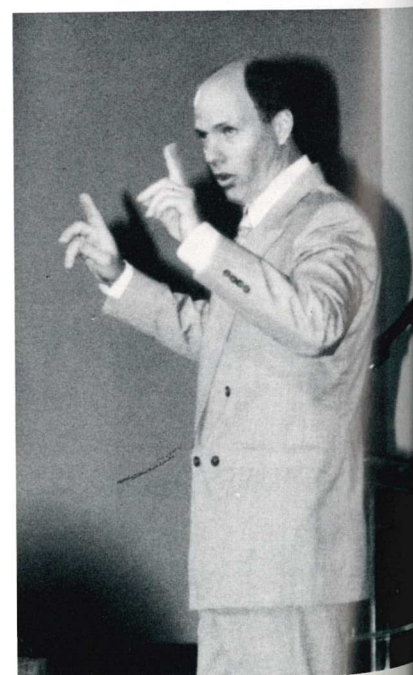

BIBLICAL STUDIES

Trinity is dedicated to preparing Christian workers for various areas of ministry and service. Because of this commitment, Biblical Studies has become the foundation on which all other programs at Trinity are built. Biblical Studies provides a strong basis of knowledge to draw from that enhances all other areas of study. Classes include studies in Doctrine, Theology, and Biblical Interpretation as well as Surveys of the Old and New Testament and studies of individual books of the Bible.



MINISTERIAL STUDIES

Ministerial Studies involves a double major in combination with the Biblical Studies major. It is for those students pursuing a full-time pastoral or evangelistic ministry or planning further studies at the seminary level. Classes include Principles of Preaching, Ministerial Relations, Church Administration, and Personal Evangelism. The program also includes ministry internship where students have an opportunity to minister in a practical setting under the supervision of an experienced pastor.



MISSIONS

The Missions programs are designed to prepare students for missionary service at home and abroad. A combined Missions major or a Missions minor along with the Biblical Studies major are both offered. Each year a missionary in Residence teaches in the department. This year it was Billy and Jasmine Bray from Malawi East Africa.



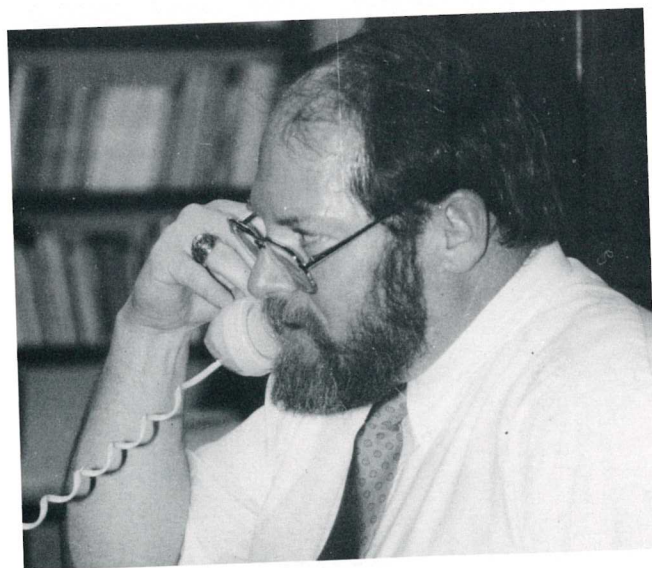
ELEMENTARY EDUCATION

The Elementary Education major combined with the Biblical Studies major not only gives students a solid Bible background, but also provides the necessary professional education courses to enable them to be skilled teachers in either Christian or public schools. Classes include method courses in education and student teaching field experience.



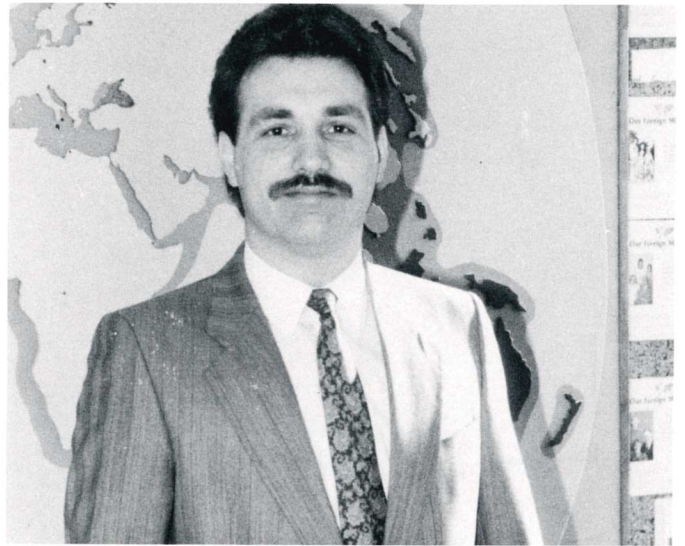
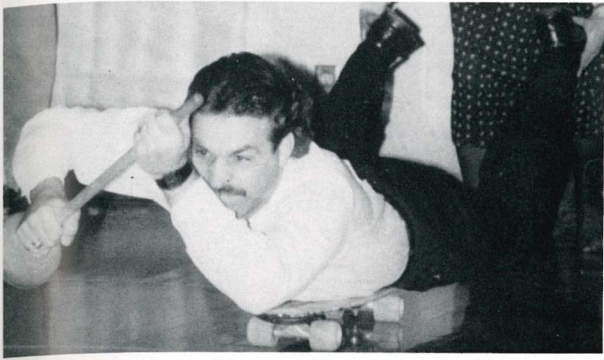
CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

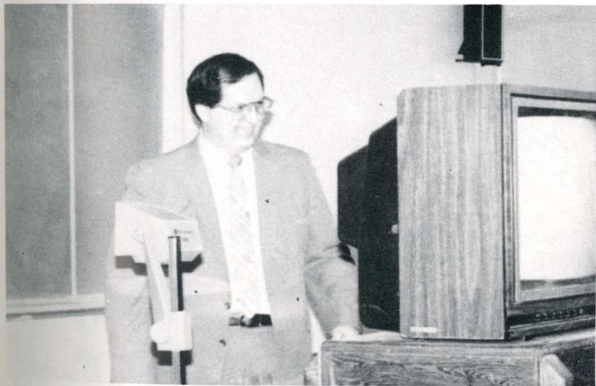
YOUTH MINISTRIES

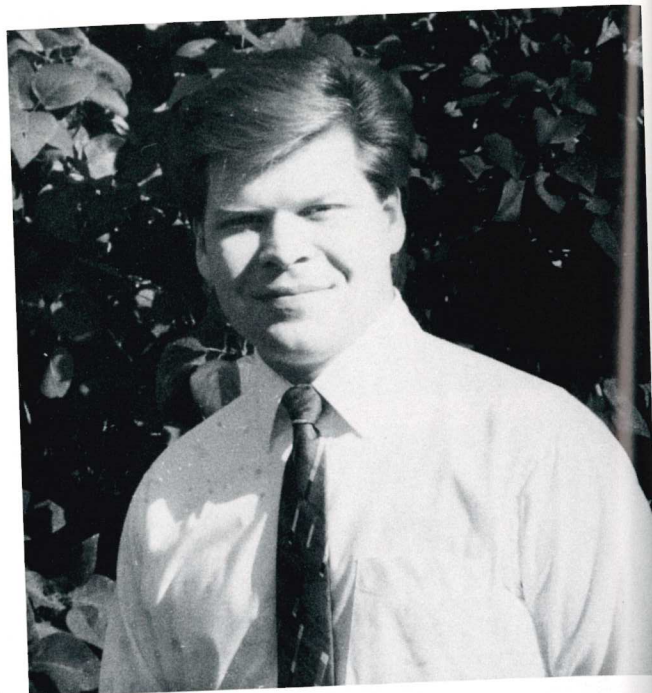
HUMAN RELATIONS

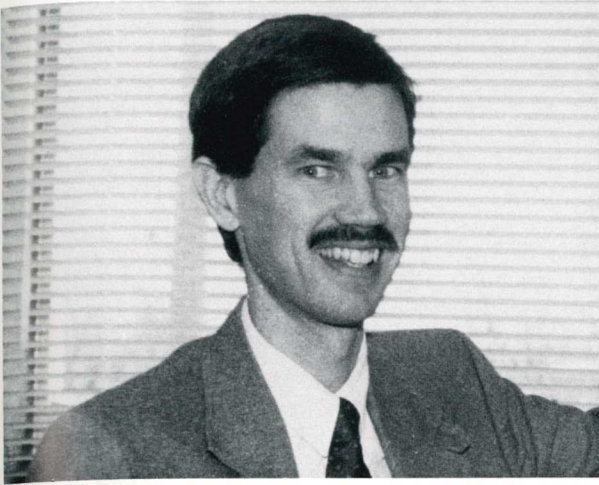
MUSIC AND DRAMA

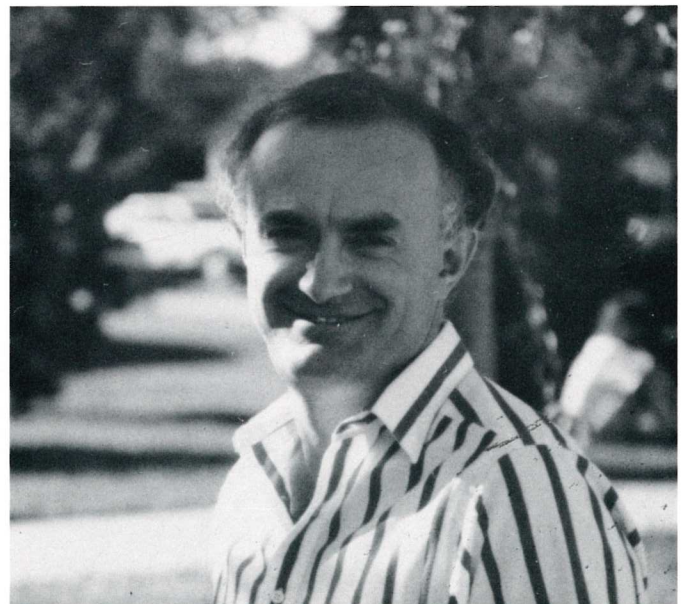
BUSINESS MANAGEMENT

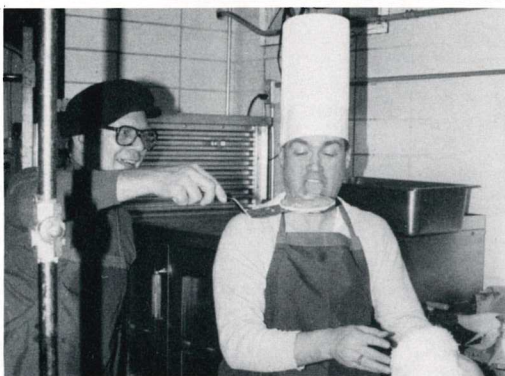
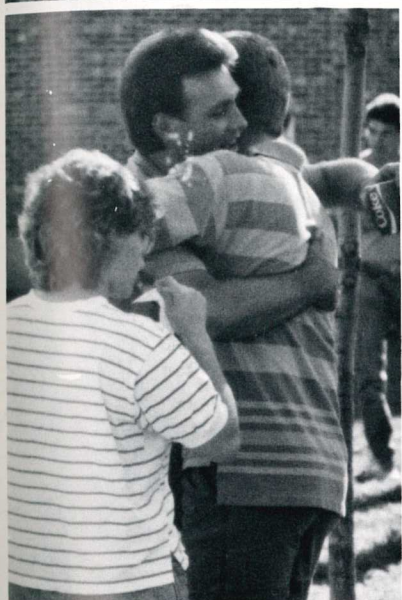

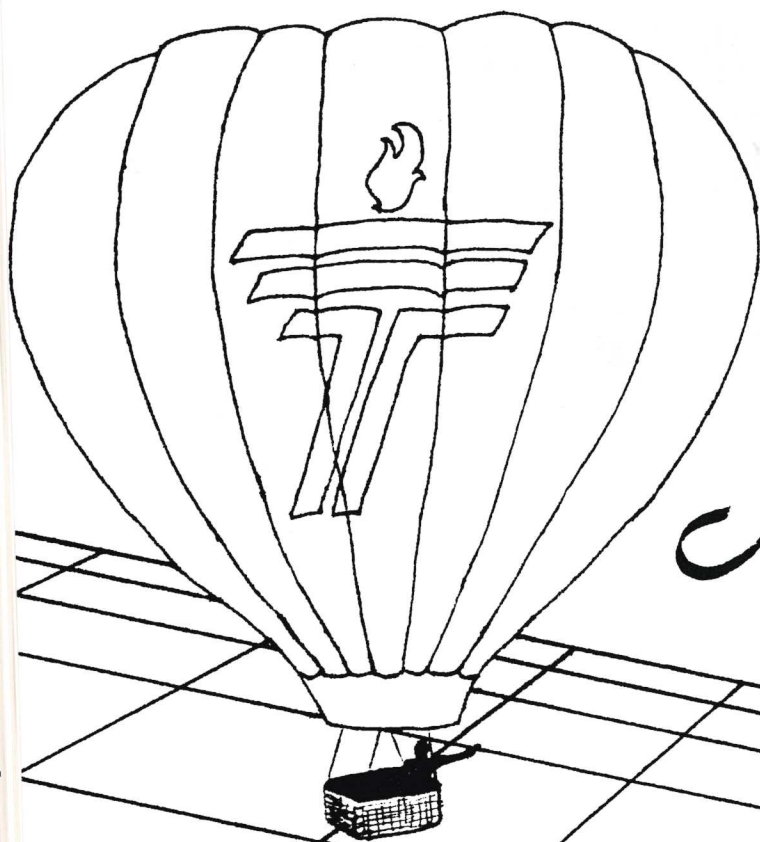
GENERAL EDUCATION

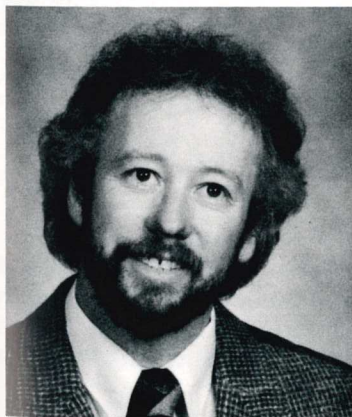

Over all, the season was a ministry to other schools as the team sought opportunity to share their faith in word and competition.

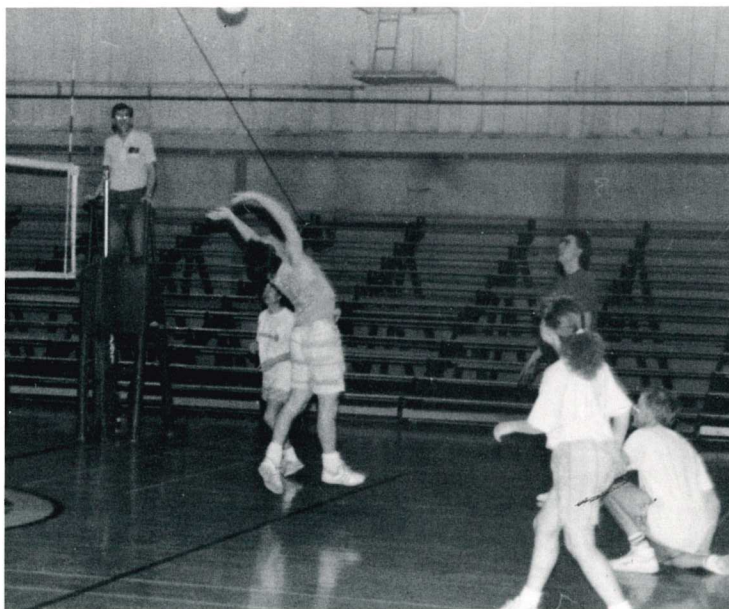
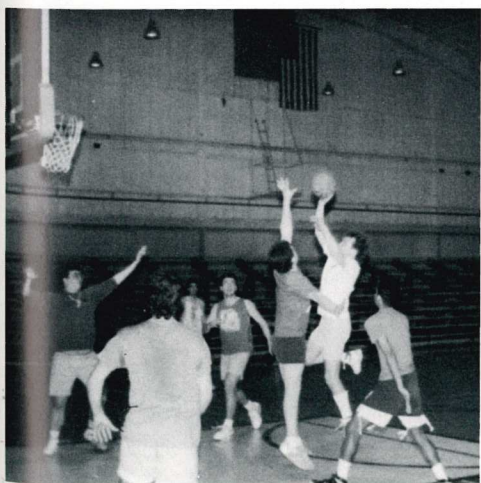
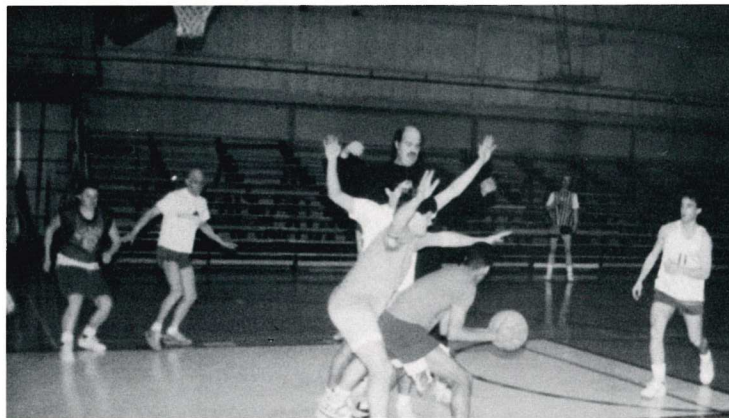
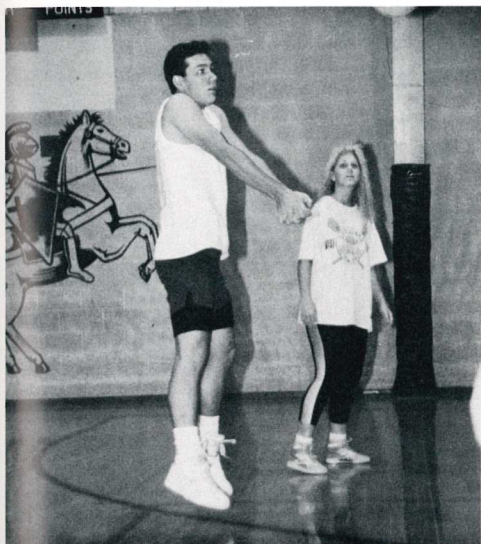


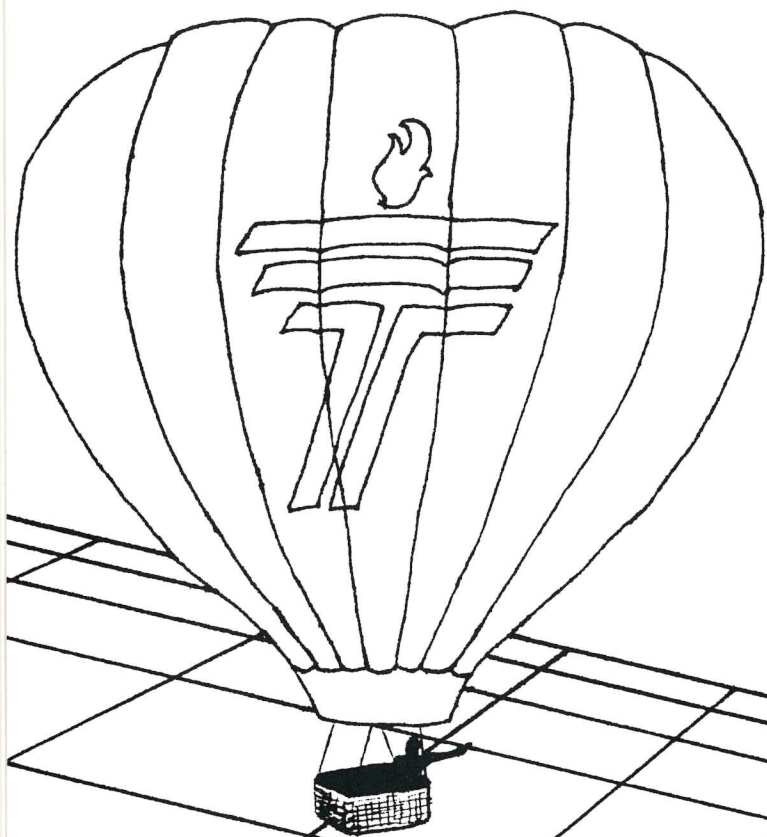

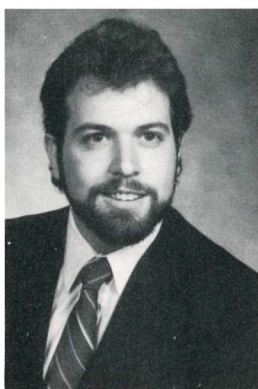


Appreciation David Martin
