*For when I think of courage I think of Scott Nelson.*



He attended Trinity for a year and a half, then was diagnosed with Hodgkin's disease in the summer of 1991. Following this discovery he went through chemotherapy and radiation treatment, attending school as much as possible. At the present time, the cancer is in remission and Scott is serving as an associate pastor in a Rockford church, while continuing his education by correspondence. *Whatever the case, the world will be impacted by the few hundred people who go forth in the name of the Lord.*

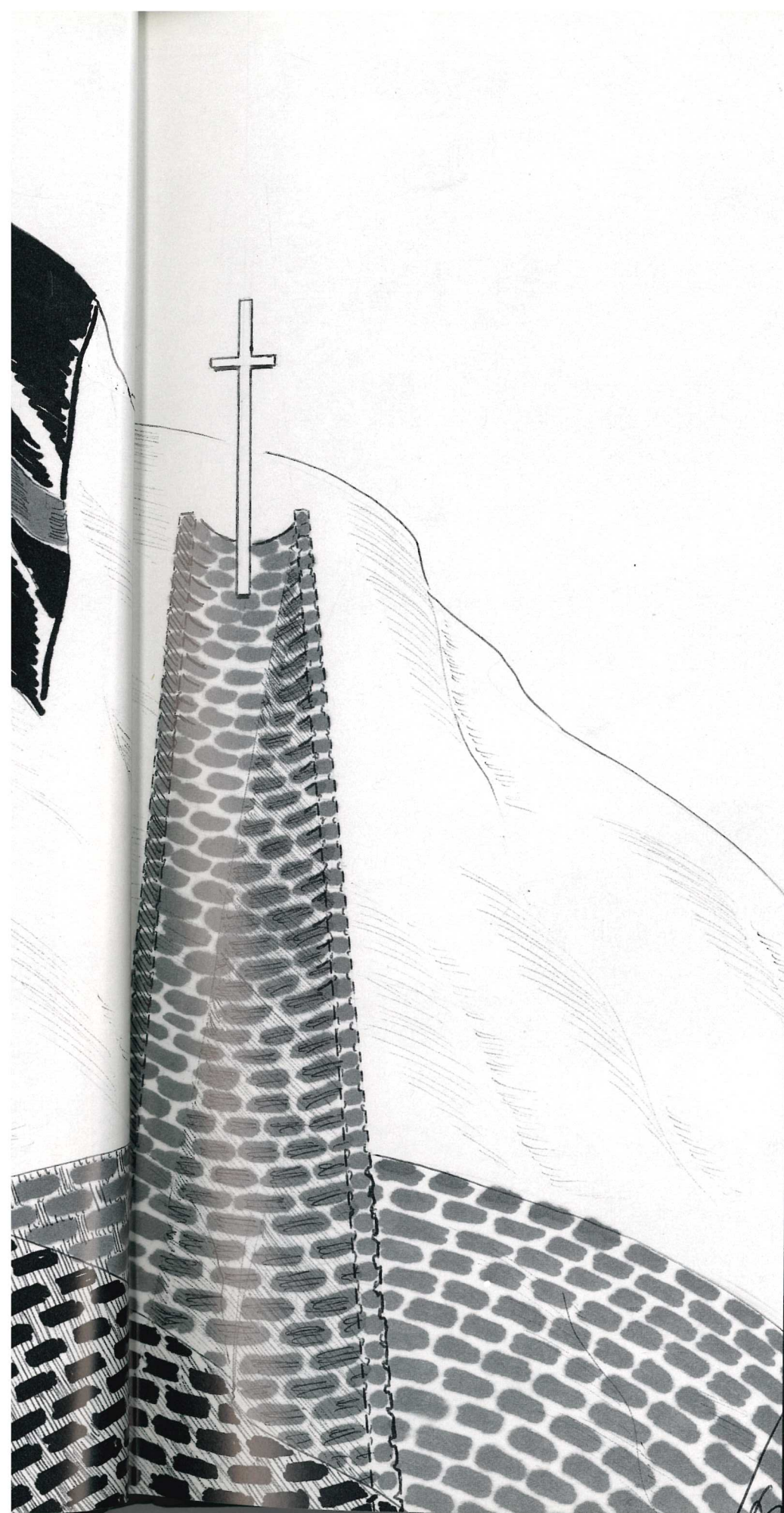

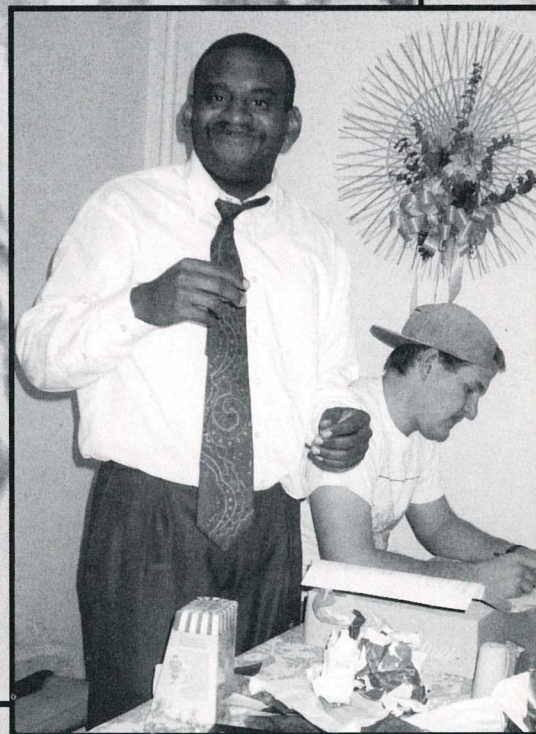
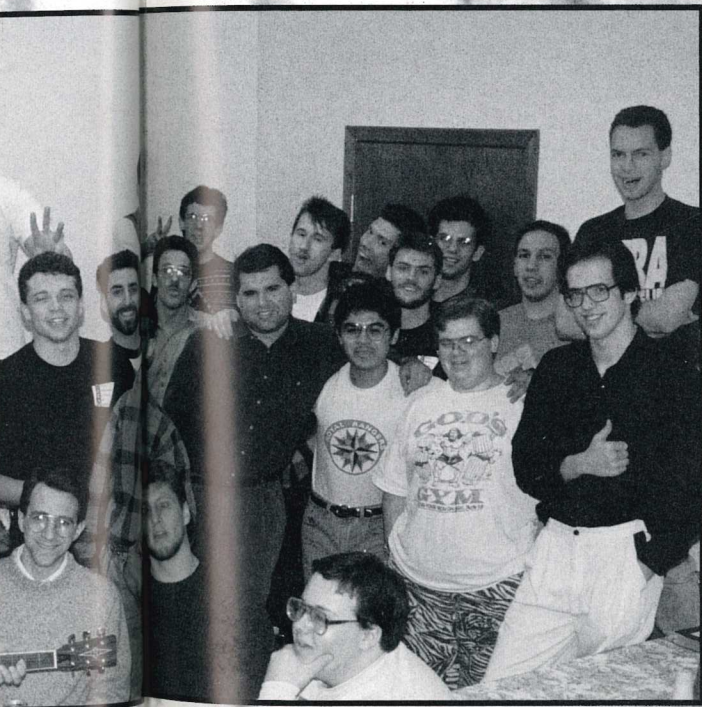
# ON THE WINGS

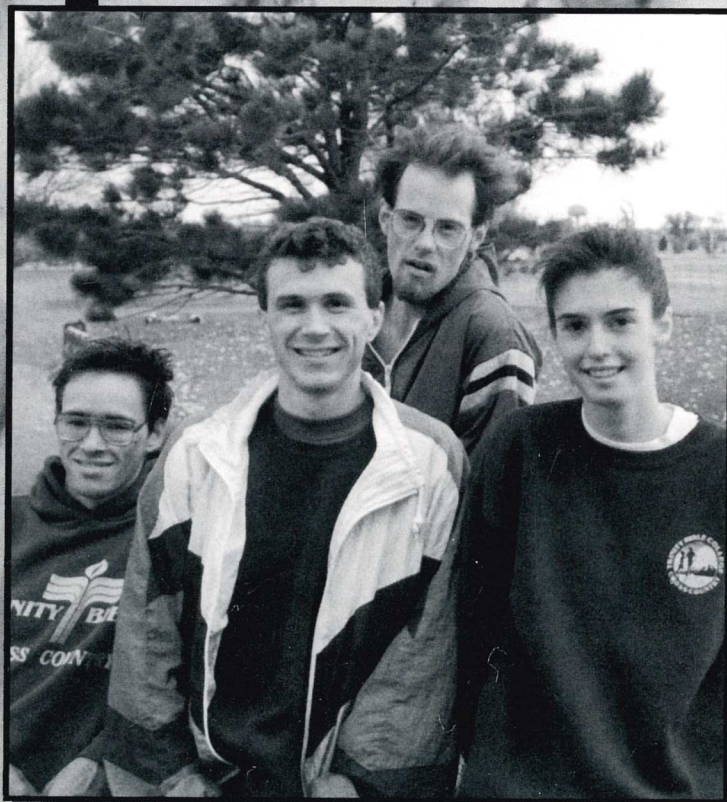


# Cross Country

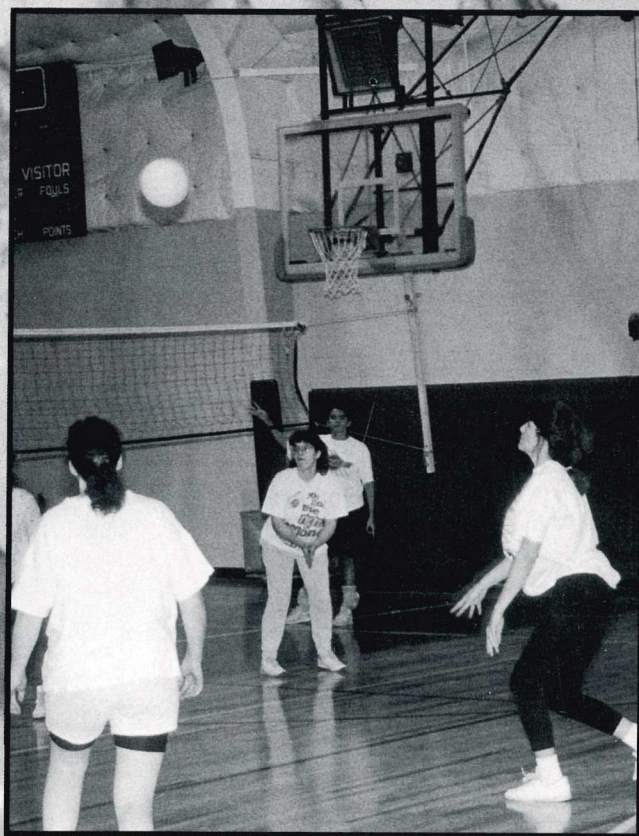




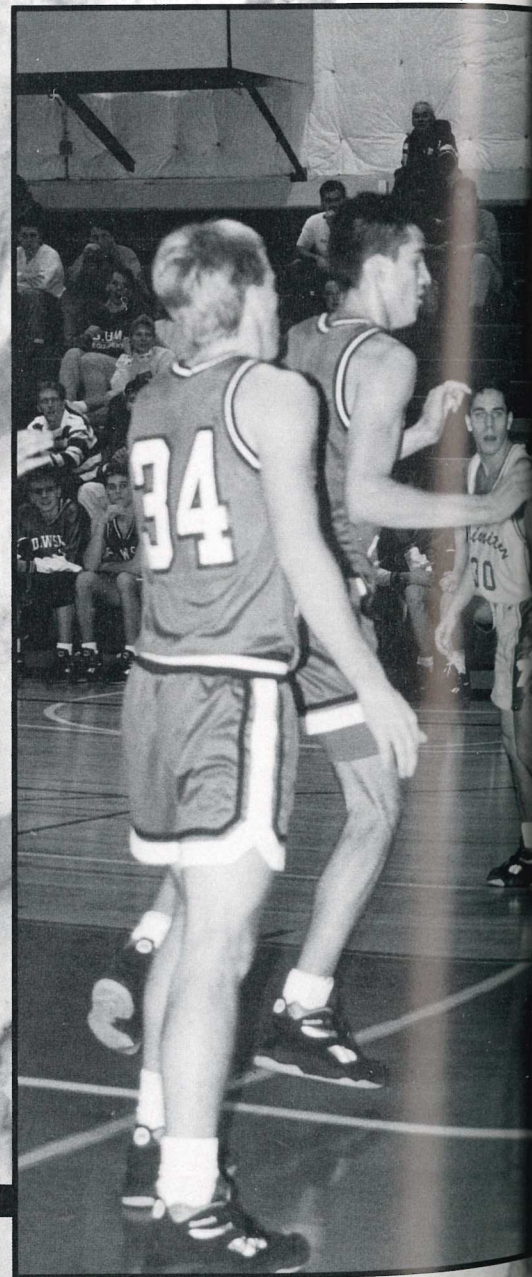
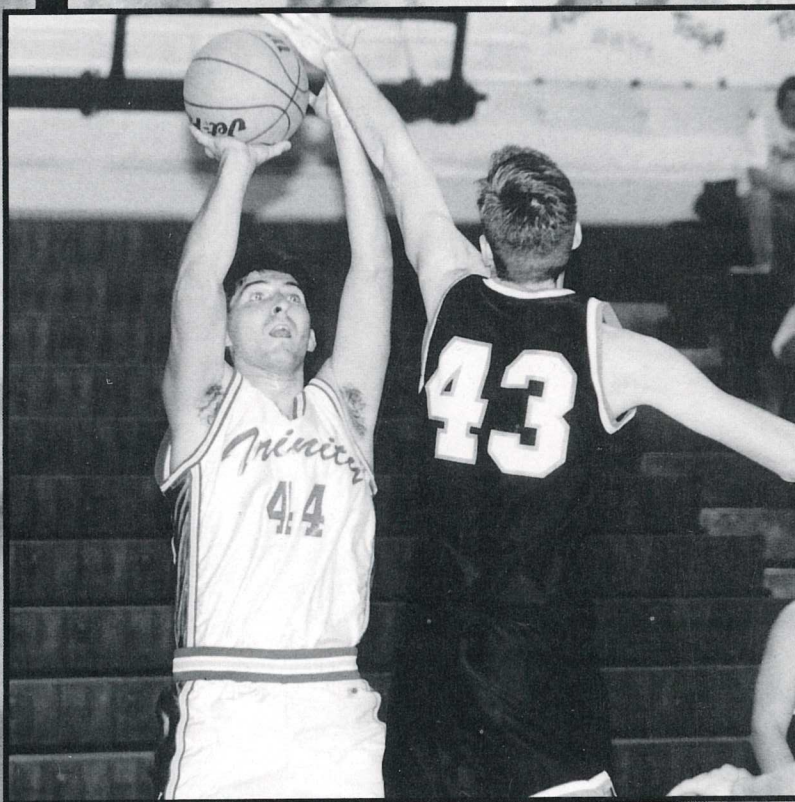
# Intramurals

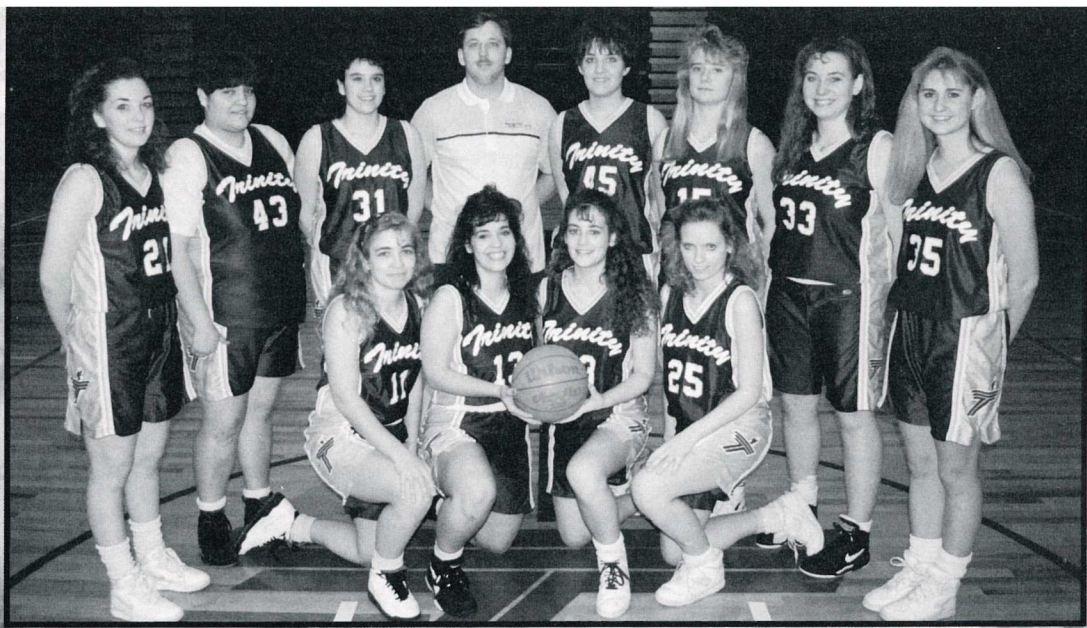

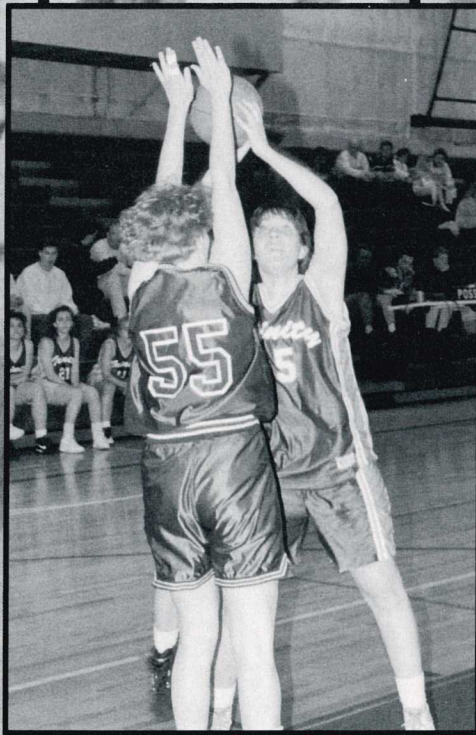

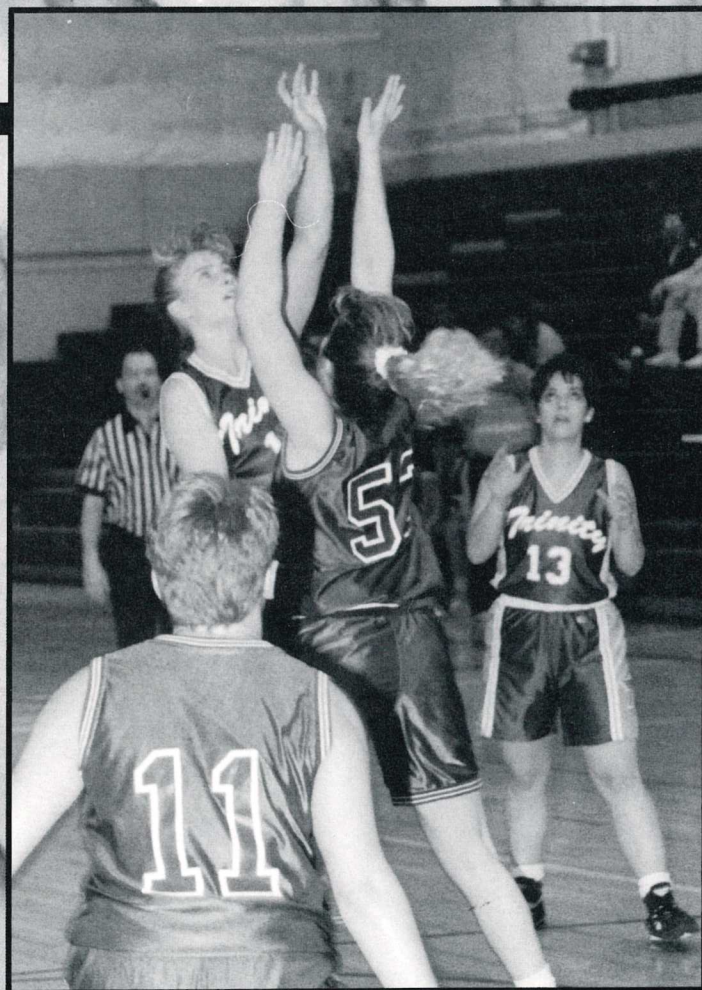




## Women's Basketball

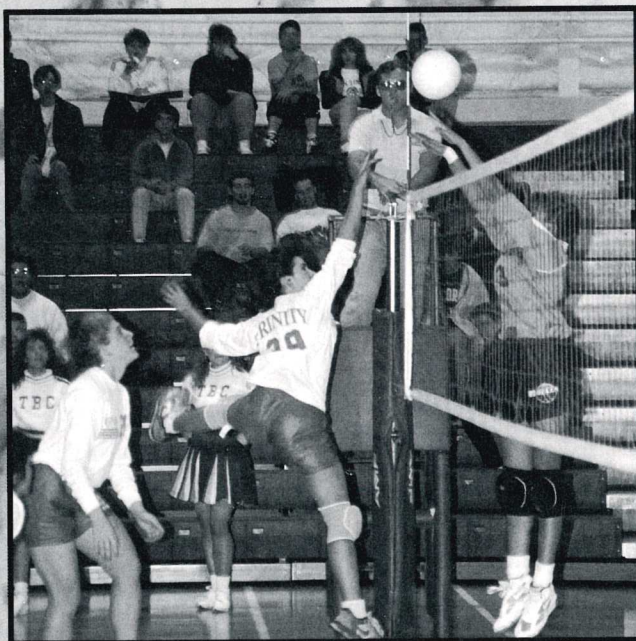




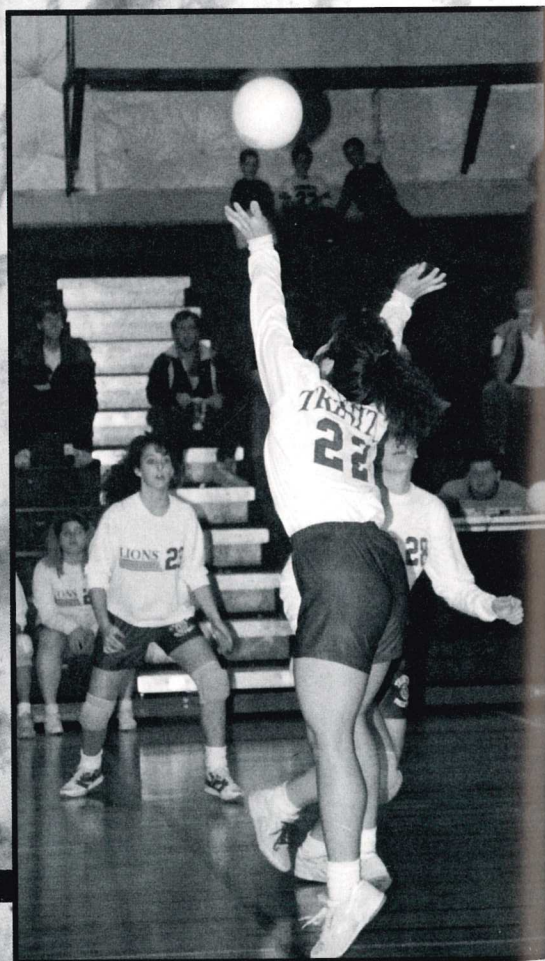
# WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL

## AUGUST

*Hurricane Andrew*

*Hurricane Andrew struck southern Florida on August 24, 1992, with winds gusting to 164 miles per hour and a 12-foot tidal surge that flattened many homes, uprooted trees, flung boats into the streets, and wrecked an entire Air Force base.*

*The hurricane continued on, carving its way through the plantation country of Louisiana, throwing tornadoes like darts at a 100-mile-wide target and pumping torrents of rain at a storm weary state. Fifty-five deaths were directly or indirectly linked to the hurricane . . . 41 in Florida, 10 in Louisiana, and 4 in the Bahamas.*

*Yet with all of the destruction, paths were quickly carved for a massive relief effort. In spite of all the work, months later many neighborhoods still looked like a war zone. Into this came ten students from Trinity as part of a larger effort to evangelize and rebuild in the Miami/Ft. Lauderdale area. Door-to-door and church ministry were undertaken, as well as reconstruction of several church buildings. As students rebuilt on the outside, God rebuilt on the inside of many hearts.*

## *First Child to Divorce Parents*

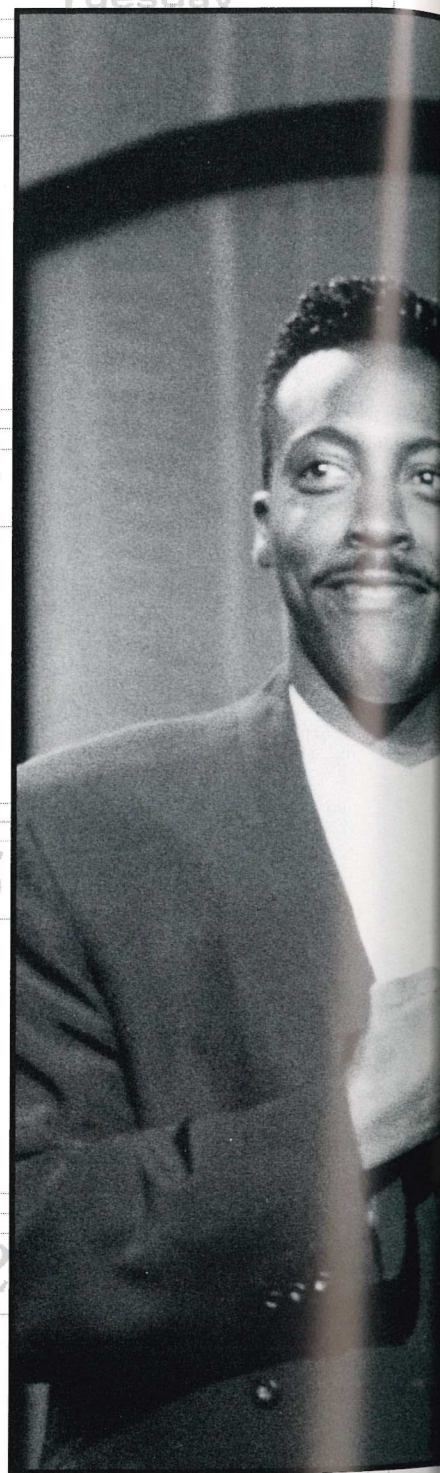
*In a society where the average divorce rate has jumped to 50% in the last several years, it is no wonder that the family system has tremendously declined.*

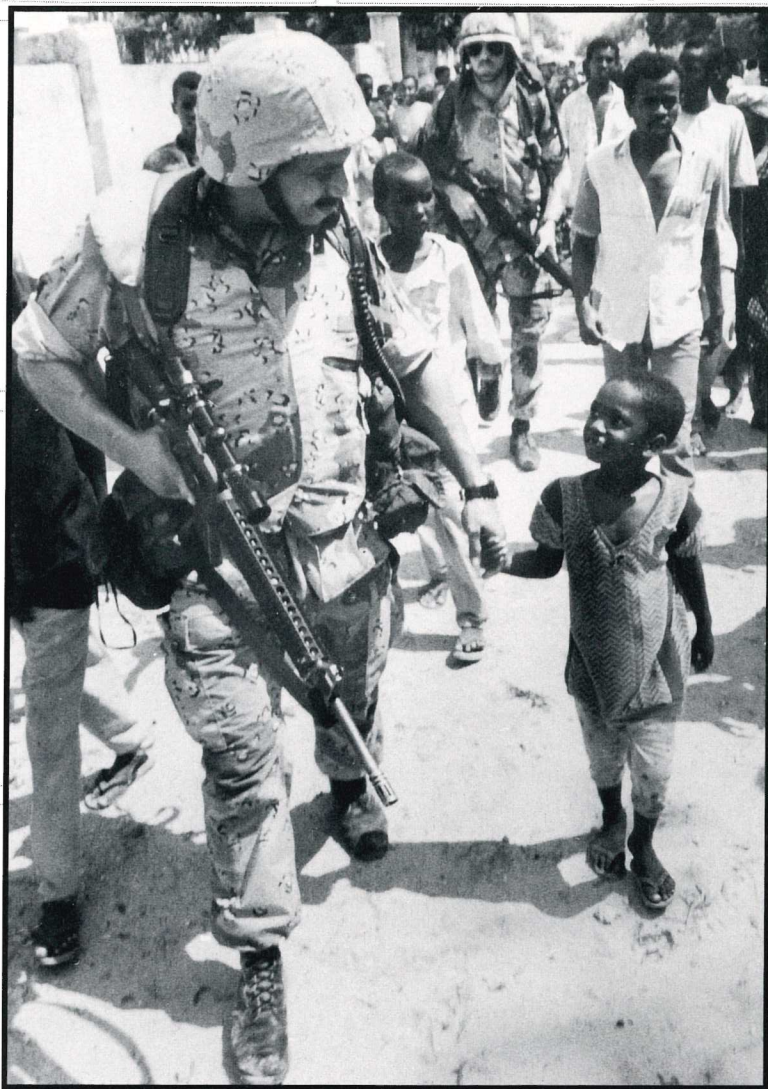

He was charged with three murders in 1990 and 1991, but each case was dismissed on the fact that the patients made the decision to end their lives, not Kevorkian. In December 1992 the state legislature passed a bill stating that assisting a person in suicide is a criminal felony with penalties ranging from 4 + years in prison and a fine up to \$2,000.00. Kevorkian claims his main opponents are "religious right wing fanatics who are making people suffer." "I don't care about the law," he told Newsweek, "I have never cared about anything but the welfare of the patient in front of me."*

## *The Breakup of Yugoslavia*

*The territory of Yugoslavia was a battleground between the Austro-Hungarian and Ottoman empires for centuries.*

*In 1918, the Kingdom of the Serbs, Croats, and Slovenes was declared, and in 1929 it was renamed Yugoslavia. The new country was torn by demands for autonomy by Croatsians who opposed Serbian domination.*

*Of the 24 million people living there, Serbs account for about 36% and the Croats for about 20% of the population. This ethnic diversity has been a source of strife for centuries.*

*President Tito, who ruled from 1945 until his death in 1980, kept a tight lid on these internal ethnic rivalries. Since his death, however, the central power has been eating away by the feuding republics.*

*Inhabitants of the territory are confronted daily by the shelling, sniper fire, and death of war. They take to the streets during the ceasefire, pushing and shoving, trying to buy food and other staples necessary to live.*

*The war has left thousands dead, sent more than a million fleeing, and led to the creation of dreaded detention camps, likened to those of Nazi Germany.*

*In February of 1993 the United States, on behalf of a greater United Nations effort, has parachuted tons of food and medical supplies to the thousands out of reach of delayed relief convoys.*

*Disaster in Waco*

February 28th marked the beginning of a fifty-one day siege of a cult compound just outside of Waco, Texas. The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms approached the compound with a search warrant for the Branch Davidian cult leader, David Koresh, on grounds of possession of illegal weapons. Intelligence claims that Koresh was tipped off and a gunfight ensued, which resulted in the death of four federal agents and an unspecified number of cultists.

As the story captivated the country's attention for nearly two months, agents began to take action. Irritating tear-gas was loaded onto tanks, which rammed into the main building to deliver its cargo. Suddenly fire broke out, and within minutes, the Davidian Cult Compound was engulfed in flames. Eighty cult members, including seventeen children, died in the flames... but authorities later discovered that many members, including David Koresh, were shot prior to ever having contact with flames. Whether or not this was part of a mass suicide plan has yet to be determined. However, this incident has brought about a new awareness of the hundreds of cults that currently exist in the United States today.

*Second Rodney King Trial Pending*

In early April, a federal court retried four Los Angeles police officers on the charge of violating Rodney King's civil rights. The jury deliberated over five days before they reached a decision. Two officers were found guilty, and two were acquitted of all charges.

Controversy was this case's constant companion. The media seemed to want riots to reoccur in L.A. as hours upon hours of new time was dedicated to the coverage of the trial, as well as the reaction of those in south-central L.A..

Legal controversy was also an issue. The American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), as liberal as they come, even agreed that trying the officers on rehashed charges was double-jeopardy and unconstitutional. The NAACP made contradicting statements regarding the punishment of hate crimes in the case of Rodney King, while defending the actions of the youth in the Reginald Denning beating. (Denning was a truck driver pulled from his semi at random and nearly beaten to death as a reaction to the first trial's outcome).
