



She came to us from Columbia Falls, Montana after she was filled with the Holy Spirit and entered Trinity's missions program. She graced our campus for a few years, and exhibited the Christ-like qualities of faith in God, joy in hard times, cheerfulness and hospitality.

This remarkable woman was Diane Barnhart, whose name is perhaps unfamiliar to many of us. Although many of us did not know her personally, we can all learn a lesson from Diane. Because her cancer never went into remission, Diane suffered most of her college career. Yet she remained, in the words of her friend, Lavonne Larson, "So cheerful, friendly ... the sort of person who made you feel good to be around. She had an unwavering faith in the Lord." Judy Cochran also described her as a woman who was strong in faith, a lover of people, "sold out to Jesus," and a true giver. Diane majored in Missions, and after she learned she had breast cancer, added a minor in Office Administration. Her ministries included having a cell group for singles, which met weekly, and she was very involved in Native American ministries.


Diane died this past summer from kidney failure which was a result of the cancer. She always encouraged others in her quiet way, while she dealt with her cancer and strove to fulfill her college requirements despite health setbacks. In April 1995, her family received a Bachelor of Arts degree Honoris Cousa in her honor.


Senior Dedication




Men Of Kesler...















North And South Wings



What are your strengths regarding Trinity's leadership?







Inauguration of Dr. Howard L. Young

During your college years, who did you look up to?


My voice instructor. She was a Mormon and escaped from Hungary ... we differed in our beliefs but I respected her perseverance and humility.






KTBC Radio 99.1




Spring Drama Production














Mission Convention























Graduation 1995

Your senior class advisor commends the graduating class of 1995 for enduring four years of torture: learning by heart some antiquated stuff!


