


Your faithfulness to God and His Word has impacted our lives forever. May God bless you and your family as you now follow His leading outside of this Trinity "bubble."












YEARBOOK APPRECIATION


















FINE ARTS TRAVEL TEAMS

Trinity Fine Arts put four traveling ministry teams on the road again this year, and logged more than 18,000 to hold services in twenty-nine states. The music and drama teams minister in church settings, youth rallies ventions and summer camps, public and private schools, special events, and even help with inner city out Three of the teams lead workshops for churches in the areas of drama and human videos.

Traveling on weekends during the school year, three teams--SERVANT'S HEART, REDEMPTION, and I HEART--held fifty-seven church services in North and South Dakota and western Minnesota. During March (over Spring Break) each team held ten services, and on May tour each team held 24-33 for a total of more tha services on tours and more than 175 for the school year.

The fourth team, VISION, traveled eight weeks in the summer, ministering in seven weeks of youth camps the upper mid-west and Alaska. VISION primarily ministers through drama and human videos, but also uses live music in their services. This team held weekend church services as travel demands between camps would mit, and held a ten-day tour during the week of July Fourth.

Although many people at Trinity don't even know it exists, Trinity Fine Arts is very proud of its fifth team--PORT. This team provides our program with hours and hours of behind-the-scenes work each week. Some ca bookings and work in our office, others give administrative assistance with recruitment and public relations. team members keep our vehicles running the thousands of miles we travel each year. Our most important members are the hundreds of people, just like you, who have committed to regularly pray for our ministry. Wi these team members we would never make it to any of our services, much less have the privilege of ministerin everyone on SUPPORT, we want to express a huge THANK YOU from everyone you send to the front lines.
