
Who We Are

The year 1998 marks the 50th anniversary of Trinity Bible College. In 1948, a local North Dakota pastor had a vision from God. With the support of Rev. G.L. Rife and Rev. W.H. Kesler, Mr. L.E. Englar founded Lakewood Park Bible School. In 1948, the school opened its doors in Devils Lake, North Dakota, with a mere 18 students enrolled. Soon the enrollment grew and the facilities at Lakewood were no longer large enough. By the grace of God an opportunity arose for the facility to move to Aberdeen, South Dakota. In the fall of 1960, Hub City Bible Institute opened. Through the years, the enrollment grew tremendously until the facilities in Aberdeen were no longer large enough either. Then the former Trinity Hospital in Jamestown, North Dakota closed and the building was purchased. The school moved to Jamestown and opened its doors in 1967, under the new name Trinity Bible Institute. The enrollment by this time was at 183 students. The enrollment continued to grow and the facilities soon became too small.

Through faith and prayer and by the grace of God, an opportunity came up to purchase the old University of North Dakota--Ellendale branch, in Ellendale. In 1972, the facilities were purchased for a single dollar. The school opened in 1972, with enrollment at 333 students first semester. In 1983, the school recognizing its accreditation status, was finally renamed Trinity Bible College.

Today, 50 years later, the school still stands through prayer and faith, as a place of preparation for men and women for the ministry and mission of Jesus Christ.

Hearts A Flame







Evangelism Ministry

Family Fellowship


